(Program/Foreign) *I have been involved also in program and legal work overseas for 30+ years in Europe, Asia and Australia doing a mix of academic, financial, economic and development matters. For the past ten years, via LFIP, <http://www.lfip.org>, I have run independent instructional technology operations in Indonesia and the US. We produce our own streaming video, websites, online materials and videoconferencing to avoid IP issues with commercial vendors like Blackboard, Westlaw and Lexis in the legal education consortium context. In parallel, for the past five years, I have run international multidisciplinary symposia (Barnes Symposium, <http://www.barnessymposium.org>, see below), as videoconferenced multisite conferences, for example the 2009 Barnes Symposium covering Muslim and Christian relations with two primary sites in Abu Dhabi and Columbia, SC, plus three secondary Indonesian sites participating, and one speaker videoconferenced in from Ankara, Turkey).*

PI & Program Director for institutional partnership project of the University of South Carolina, Jakarta Stock Exchange (BEJ) and Graduate Law Programs of the University of Indonesia with Gadjah Mada University plus seven other foreign and domestic universities for distance education, financial sector and law reform work with government, private sector and academic institution participation initially supported with \$1,200,000 by USAID (<http://www.lfip.org>, USAID-supported 1/00-1/02, 7/02-7/04). I resided in Jakarta 2000-01 to start up LFIP, then commuted half-time to Indonesia 2002-04, and currently spend circa 20% of my time in Southeast Asia (and am present via shared videoconferenced courses on a weekly basis during the academic year at UI and UGM in particular). LFIP has now evolved into a self-supporting academic NGO or project consortium since 2004 end of USAID funding. Since 2000 I have maintained an office at the downtown Jakarta UI-Salemba campus, but currently spend more time in Yogyakarta at UGM on account of the recently commenced twinned degree program (SH-JD). This is a somewhat unusual arrangement, since UI and UGM together are the Oxbridge or Harvard and Yale pairing of Indonesian higher education.
