## From The Director...

As we arrive at the beginning of summer, I wanted to update you on activities in the library this past spring.

We ended the Spring semester on a very sad note with the passing of James Greenlee, long-time employee in the Technical Services Department of the Law Library. James served as a Library Assistant in the Law Library since 1999 and served at the University since 1996. James will be missed. See more about James' life elsewhere in this newsletter.

The Law Library joined a special initiative to digitize the early records of the thirteen original colonies. LLMC Digital, a consortium of law libraries, is tackling the complex project of digitizing the *Early State Records*, an extraordinary trove of primary source materials from early British, Spanish and French colonial times to the eve of the American Civil War. The first phase of this project will focus on the thirteen original colonies and will include 1,100,000 + pages or 4,166 volumes of primary source material. In addition, LLMC Digital will catalog each document, providing title access previously not available.

The librarians are busy preparing for the move to the new library. All materials are being classified for the move. The weeding of the collection is moving forward. The rails for the compact shelving in the basement of the new building are installed. Plans call for a move in May/ June of 2017.

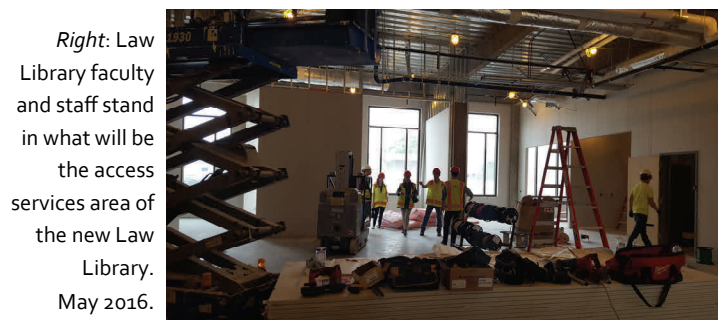
## New USC Law School Construction Progress
